2019 AT A GLANCE

What a great year! Kids Klub has continued to grow and improve. Enrollment across all of our programs has increased by nearly 100 students this year! The Kids Klub Advisory Board welcomed six new Board Members in 2019. The Klub House Rock! Annual Fundraiser had an increase in sponsorship and attendance this year. This was our most profitable event to date. Kids Klub Whelan received reaccreditation from the Council on Accreditation (COA) this year, showing our commitment to quality.

This year was also a big year for presenting our programs to school committees and school personnel. Kids Klub answered a Request for Proposal for before and after school programs in North Providence and Woonsocket. We are excited to report that our program was selected to receive these contracts! These contracts extend our programs for an additional two to four years. We are honored to have been chosen and recognized for our quality programs.

North Providence Kids Klub had facility changes in 2019. There are two brand new buildings - James L. McGuire Elementary School and Stephen Olney Elementary School. In October, Kids Klub relocated

from the Whelan Elementary building to the new Stephen Olney building. This move allowed us to better meet the needs of our families and to expand our services.

Kids Klub was honored to receive a grant from the Woonasquatucket River Watershed Council from the Environmental Protection Agency for a second year. This \$2,575 grant provided students the opportunity to attend science and environmental based field trips and enrichments.

A new partnership between Kids Klub and PrepareRI was a huge success this summer. Students from the PrepareRI internship program worked at Kids Klub with school age children at the North Providence Kids Klub Hasbro Summer Learning Program. This paid internship provided the high school students with opportunities for hands-on experience. They jumped right into the action, planning team building games for the students to participate in, and developing a civics curriculum.

The civics curriculum was created to enhance the students' civics education by increasing students' knowledge of the rights and duties of all citizens. Students learn about what it means to be an American, governments around the world, branches of government, how a bill becomes a law, the bill of rights, and more. The PrepareRI interns worked with Kids Klub to create this six-week civics curriculum for students in grades 3-5.

Students also entered a contest to receive a free week's stay at Coldspring Resort in New Hampshire! Nyiella from Kids Klub Pothier was this year's lucky winner! She attends Pothier Elementary School and Kids Klub Pothier in Woonsocket. Read Nyiella's winning essay:

Another student contest held was to design our company Thanksgiving card. This is the 29th Annual Holiday Card contest. The winning artist was Oluwatosin Adebayo-Agbekaku from Kids Klub Stephen Olney. Her design was printed on the Thanksgiving card that was distributed to over 3,000 homes and businesses in November 2019.

In December 2019, Stop & Shop Greenville selected Kids Klub as their non-profit of the month. Their Community Bag Program is designed to make it easy for Stop & Shop customers to contribute to their community while supporting the environment. For every "Give Back" bag purchased within the month, Stop & Shop donated \$1 to Kids Klub. This program provided Kids Klub with \$124.



About KIDS KLUB

Founded in 1987, Kids Klub provides quality care and education for children kindergarten through 12 years old. Kids Klub operates before & after school programs and full time programs during school vacations, summer break, and when school is not in session.

Kids Klub is a non profit 501(c)3 with sites that are licensed by the Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) and are Nationally Accredited by Council On Accreditation (COA).



BEFORE SCHOOL

Mornings are filled with activities to help "wake the brain" as children arrive and begin their day. Students are given the opportunity to choose activities based on their interests and engage in structured activities. A nutritious breakfast is included in the cost of tuition. Homework assistance is always available.

AFTER SCHOOL

Kids Klub staff ensure all children arrive at the site after school ends. Students complete "brain break" activities and enjoy a nutritious snack. Homework support and assistance takes place every day after school. Kids Klub provides an opportunity for physical activity each day through a designated time to focus on health, wellness, and fitness.

FULL DAY & VACATION

Kids Klub offers learning opportunities all year round! During school vacations or summer months, our programs offer a wide variety of STEAM curriculum, hands-on learning experiences, field trips, site visitors, and service learning.

Summer learning is a great way for children to not only make lifelong friends but also to mitigate summer learning loss while they are out of school! Our summer programs include a nutritious breakfast, lunch, and snack each day. Children stay active and fit by participating in many activities both indoors and outdoors.






Mad Science delivered an enrichment on the World of Science! Students explored how science is at work in the world around them. They learned about the animal kingdom, both on land and under the sea. Students also made mixtures and explored the science of motion and energy. They also discovered the technology that powers our modern world and keeps us connected.

Professor Gizmo's Workshop focused on a whole range of projects and presentations for the beginning engineer and scientist. Using common objects, students created projects such as puppets and race cars, experiment with bubbles, learn to use LED's, and much more.

Student Mentors BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS

Kids Klub values our partnerships with local schools and educational institutions. Two successful partnerships this year were the Rhode Island College Athletic Department students visiting North Providence Kids Klub sites as well as Mount Saint Charles Academy students visiting Kids Klub Bernon.

Rhode Island College Athletic Department's student athletes assisted Kids Klub students with homework and played games with the children. RIC student athletes do community service to set an example for the future.

Mount Saint Charles Academy students, as part of their service learning program, spend time mentoring the students at Kids Klub Bernon by helping with homework. Another focus of this service learning project by Mount Saint Charles students is the importance of building skills in reading. To achieve this, the high school students spend both one-on-one time reading with Kids Klub students, as well as group read-alouds.

These are ongoing partnerships that have developed over many years. They encourage the elementary school students to continue their education and to explore all opportunities available!

A "High Five" FOR TEAMWORK!

Each year Kids Klub holds a contest asking students to write an answer to the question "why is teamwork important to you?" An essay is chosen from each Kids Klub site. Family ENGAGEMENT

An integral and highly significant aspect of Kids Klub's philosophy is the importance of open communication between the sites and families. Parents are encouraged to give input on the implementation of new ways to enhance their child's daily experience. Effective family engagement builds genuine relationships with families.



COMMUNITY ART CONTEST

Families and students engage with the community in this annual contest. Each site chooses a local community partner (such as a restaurant, deli, library, or other local establishment) to post students' artwork. Customers are invited to vote for their favorites and a winner is chosen from each Kids Klub site. The artist that receives the most votes wins a gift card of their choice.



ANTI-BULLYING NIGHT

Each year Kids Klub sites hold an Anti-Bullying Night after school. Parents and guardians are invited to participate in activities and learn about what the students have focused on to prevent bullying and have positive conflict resolutions. To further promote positive social-emotional interactions, anti-bullying activities are built into the monthly curriculum.

LIGHTS ON AFTERSCHOOL

Each year Kids Klub participates in Lights On Afterschool, a nationwide celebration of after school programs. We were one of more than 8,000 sites across the nation sending the message that after school is key to children's success, and that we must keep the lights on and doors open after school. In communities today, 15.1 million children take care of themselves after the school day ends.

HSLI Summer Learning PREVENTING THE “SUMMER SLIDE”



Summer is a unique opportunity to provide hands-on learning opportunities for children that are both academic and fun. Summer time is when the very real phenomenon called “summer learning loss” occurs if children and youth are not engaged in active learning.

The Hasbro Summer Learning Initiative (HSLI) Grant is awarded to programs that make it imperative to have service learning at their Summer Learning Program as well as reduce learning loss over the summer. This grant, with the collaboration of North Providence School Department (NPSD), has offered Kids Klub the opportunity to work alongside NPSD teachers who educate and assess approximately 65 incoming 4th through 6th grade students over a 6-week program.

Kids Klub collaborates with the Rhode Island Afterschool Network (RIAN), a statewide network of Rhode Islanders who support quality after school and summer learning opportunities for young people. RIAN encourages all educators to rethink how, when, and where children and youth learn to ensure their success and develop systems that foster positive academic outcomes for local youth, as well as support their social, emotional, and physical well-being.

Research demonstrates that all children lose up to two months of math computational skills, while children from lower-income situations also may lose up to two months of reading skills. Kids Klub’s focus on summer learning helps prevent the summer slide!




THE “SUMMER SLIDE” is what often happens to disadvantaged children during the summer months. They tread water at best or even fall behind, while higher-income children build their skills steadily over the summer months.



Most students lose TWO MONTHS of skills in mathematics every summer, and low-income children typically lose another two to three months in reading.*

Even though trash and pollutants in the world is a big problem currently, I realize now that even little thing that you do to help can change the world to a better place. Here is an example: let's say your walking down the street, you see a water bottle on the ground, what do you do? Well, before the first year of summer camp I would've probably said, “Throw it in the trash obviously.” but now, because of the summer camp that you guys set up, I would pick it up and throw it in the recycling, even now when I take my water bottle that I already used at school and I think, “Reduce, Reuse, Recycle” and I reuse it, or when I get home I recycle it.

This is what I took out from the second year. When you get the chance, always help people in your community that are less fortunate than you by donating. Even if you can spare change, it is helpful. I learned that there are people in my neighborhood, and even some of my friends, that go home and don't have any food anywhere in their house. I feel very lucky now that whenever I get hungry now, I can just walk to my fridge and get some

leftovers from some chinese food store. This summer camp year opened my eyes on how important it is to donate to the less fortunate, or just to the community in general.

I also think that this summer program was helpful in school. I think that this summer program that you get to learn awesome things in is helping me learn the values of helping the community, plus it is way more learning than you get by playing video games all summer, eating pizza, making a mess, and starting a summer packet on the day before school starts.

Summer Program Results

NORTH PROVIDENCE HSLI

As part of the North Providence Kids Klub HSLI summer program, students who will be entering 5th grade and above in the fall participate in a pre and post online survey. This is called the Survey of Academic and Youth Outcomes-Youth (SAYO-Y).

Of the approximately 65 students who attended the North Providence Kids Klub HSLI summer program, 22 students were eligible to complete these anonymous surveys. The pre-survey was completed during week one of the program and the post-survey during week six.

The survey results measure the 22 North Providence Kids Klub participants compared to 360 overall summer participants (including the North Providence Kids Klub data).


Students are asked to answer questions on a scale of 1 to 4 that focus on youth development domains as well as questions about their program experiences.

Youth in the Kids Klub program experienced the greatest gain in **Youth Feel Competent as a Learner (+6%)**





Youth were asked several single item indicator questions at post-test about their program experiences. Retrospective measures focused on academic skills, social/ personal skills and sense of competence.




OPEN RESPONSE QUESTION

Service Learning THE STUDENT JOURNEY

Kids Klub encourages the development of life skills, respect for others, and positive social interactions through a variety of service learning projects and programs. Service Learning is a hands-on and student-centered approach to learning, through instruction and reflection, which provides a meaningful experience to community service. This process is important to Kids Klub, in showing students how they can make an impact in their own communities, no matter how large or small, while also teaching leadership skills and responsibility.

Through our partnership and grant with HSLI, Kids Klub authentically and robustly makes service learning the core of our summer learning curriculum. Children and youth, over the course of a six-week, thirty-day program, become advocates in their own learning. The curriculum's focus on service learning allows children and youth to become more aware of their community by identifying issues and concerns, and then creating active solutions that ultimately lead to stronger civic engagement.

Student-Led SERVICE LEARNING

Allowing students to evaluate and choose a service learning project is important to Kids Klub. In 2019, the students of the North Providence Kids Klub Hasbro Summer Learning program chose to focus their service learning project on raising funds for the North Providence Animal Shelter, Gloria Gemma Foundation, and continuing to help make the town a more environmentally healthy place to live.

In an effort to help students learn how to be stewards of and advocates for a healthy self and environment, the students held two bake sales (with donated goods), a car wash, and collected donations around the

town, for the two causes. One committee of students also created two Little Libraries. One was installed at Evan's Park in North Providence, based on a needs assessment the students completed, and the other was installed at Cricket Field in Johnston, as part of their past Adopt-a-Spot service learning project with Woonasquatucket River Watershed Council. The students' goal was to provide more free book opportunities and to continue fostering a love for reading.

At this year's Culminating Event, a Recycled Racer Rally was held while a check for **\$1,384** was presented to recipients in front of families and friends, local businesses

and community members, school personnel and committee members, town councilmen, Assistant Superintendent Seitsinger, North Providence Police Department, and more. The Little Libraries were revealed and the end of summer video was played for everyone to see all the accomplishments the students made during the six-weeks.

MAKING A DIFFERENCE



At Kids Klub she is very respectful, following all the rules but prefers to play by herself quietly. She always has a smile on her face, but will never be the first to speak up. One rainy afternoon at camp, towards the end of summer, when everyone was disappointed they couldn't have recess outside and had to stay in the gym, Janiyah took matters into her own hands. She stood up excitedly and loudly announced to the room, "Who wants to play a group game?" One of the Kids Klub staff who works with Janiyah after school during

the year saw this right away and stated, "and THIS is why I love this program! She never before would have had the confidence to stand up and do that herself. I'm so happy she just did that." Janiyah's leadership skills really shined in that moment, and we were so proud to see her growth from after school to summer learning.



NATALIA was a new student this year at the summer learning program, just having completed 3rd grade. She was very quiet and hesitant at making new friends, keeping to herself, but a very respectful young lady. During the pre-ecomap activity, she wrote down who she lived with, but then sat struggling to come up with any connections. As the Administrator tried to help give her possible ideas, she sat not interested, saying she didn't feel a connection to any. She finally agreed upon a loose connection to school, and a strong connection to home and her birthday month. As the weeks went on, Natalia was very interested in summer learning and came much more out of her shell! At the post-ecomap when she received her paper back, she immediately started writing, first putting down a strong

connection to one of the Kids Klub teachers. She additionally added other places and camp projects that had been worked upon. We were very happy to see her progress and investment in summer learning over the course of the 6-weeks, with her excitement of building new relationships with people and places.



"My daughter **KYLIE** is in her third year of going to Kids Klub for before school care and after school enrichments. It is a safe and fun environment for children who need care outside of school hours. The enrichments are always so different and exciting - kickboxing, theatre, animal
